Thank you for your support of Southside Family Nurturing Center. Your commitment and contributions help nurture children, build on family strengths, and break cycles of intergenerational trauma.

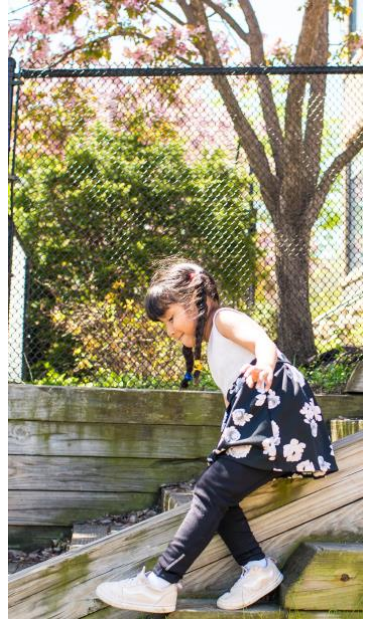

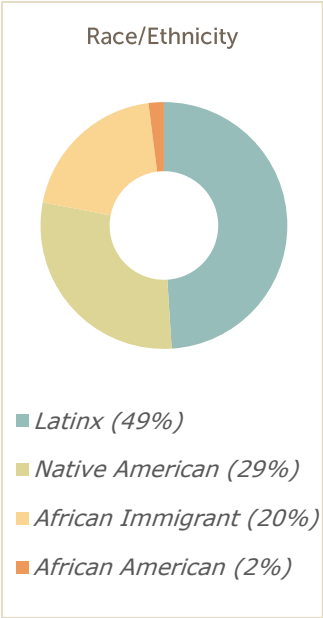
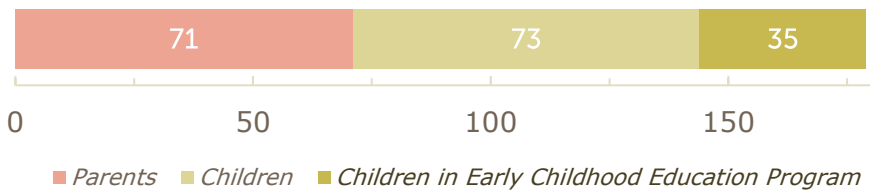
Southside Family Nurturing Center pioneered dual-generation, holistic family services.

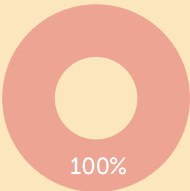

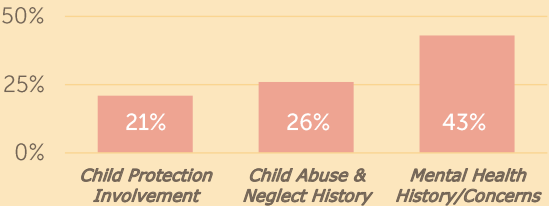

CHILDREN ARE HEALTHY.

- 88% of children are up to date with immunizations
- 100% of children completed annual well child checkups
- 100% of children engage in regular tooth brushing
- 100% of children consume a nutritious breakfast and/or lunch Monday – Friday
- 100% of children explore the world of food cultivation

CHILDREN ARE READY FOR SCHOOL.

- 81% attendance Rate over 12 months
- 93% show progress in all areas of development
- 93% who were not age appropriate received early individual therapeutic intervention: speech, OT, play, or music therapy
- 97% maintained or improved their social/emotional functioning(ASQ-SE)
- 60% of children demonstrated more than 6 months developmental progress when evaluated over a six-month period



CHILDREN LIVE IN SAFE, STABLE AND NURTURING ENVIRONMENTS.

- 74% of families demonstrate positive, responsive parenting techniques
- 91% of families consistently promote their child's language development
- 85% of families access community resources and referrals
- 88% of parent households actively participated in regular home visiting for an average home visiting and family event engagement of 4.5 hours/month



HIGHLIGHTS

2017

- Prioritized the integration of the AMAZE Anti-Bias/Anti-Discrimination Curriculum into all SSFNC classrooms with the leadership appointment of May Louise Shea as champion of the initiative.
- Diversified funding including securing one new major donor with a sustaining 3 year renewing commitment.
- Established mutually beneficial partnerships with LifeTrack, Caperneum Pediatric Therapies, and MACC Metropolitan Alliance for Connected Communities for reflective practice, deeper therapeutic impact, and efficiencies.
- Successful 2nd Annual Surly Event cultivated many new SSFNC Friends, and raised over 25K.



2018

- Celebrated Harvey Winje and Susan Gust's well-deserved retirement from Facilities Management at SSFNC after over 40 years of dedicated service to our mission.
- Submitted two requests to the Minnesota Department of Health for Family Spirit Home Visiting Program funding. Consequently in 2019, SSFNC was awarded one, 3-year MDH Evidence Based Home Visiting Grant
- Launched SSFNC's new logo and marketing campaign in partnership with Olio designer, Danielle Tornquist. Our logo speaks to the impact of safe and nurturing child/adult relationships in children's early brain development, and their essential contribution to lifetime health and education outcomes.
- Successful 3rd Annual Surly Brewing Event cultivated many new Friends and raised over \$25K
- SSFNC adopted an equity and inclusion policy to guide our work and the majority of staff roles are filled by diverse individuals reflective of the communities served in our program. Read our policy on the next page.

BEING CULTURALLY RESPONSIVE

Sam was referred for speech therapy by his teacher. When the home visitor brought the referral to the Sam's family initially, they did not want him to receive the service. They felt that the teachers were saying that Sam couldn't learn and that the way he had been communicating was incorrect. The home visitor talked to elders in the community before approaching his parents again. This time, the home visitor was able to share information about speech development in the context of their culture and highlight the child's strengths. This made the family feel comfortable with the referral. They said they felt like they were included in the conversation about their son's needs and appreciated the culturally specific information that painted a more accurate picture of their child.
