Celebrating 45-Years of Service in the South Minneapolis, Phillips Community

Founded in 1974 by three visionary women: Beverly Blinde, Linda Haugen and Jean (Winje) Christie, Southside Family Nurturing Center was one of the first private, nonprofit agencies in Minnesota to implement holistic family interventions. Ultimately, we aim to advance health and education equity across race and income in South Minneapolis with a holistic, dual generation, trauma-informed program model, including 1) Therapeutic Early Childhood Education and 2) Family Home Visiting and Support.



SSFNC Receives Funding to Expand Home Visiting

Through grants from the Minnesota Department of Health and Medica Foundation, Southside will be expanding home visiting services to an additional 24 families over the next three years. We are also transitioning from the evidence based curriculum Nurturing Parenting to Family Spirit. This comes after feedback from families about cultural relevance as well a desire to connect more authentically with Native families, for whom the curriculum was particularly designed. It is, however, easily adaptable and relevant for families of other diverse backgrounds. Currently we are hiring two additional home visitors with a preference for candidates with strong ties in the Native American community (see side bar for details). We are excited about how this expansion will deepen our impact with families and our community.
